

Year Six Summer Term 2024



SCIENCE *Light*

The children will learn about light sources and explore how light travels. They will carry out a variety of science investigations looking at how shadows are formed and how they change throughout the day. They will also find out about reflection and refraction.

GEOGRAPHY *Trade Links*

In this topic, the children will learn about key aspects of human geography including the supply of natural resources such as food, energy, minerals and water. They will also gain an understanding of different countries' economic activity and their trade links around the world.



HISTORY

Local Study: Bletchley Park

Throughout this topic the children will explore Bletchley Park and the nature of the work that took place here during the war. As well as recognising the key contributions of our local area, we will also focus on the life and work of Alan Turing and his exceptional efforts during WW2.



ENGLISH *Visual Literacy*

We will use the short film "Eye of the storm" to provide a stimulus for the children to write a variety of narrative texts.

Romeo and Juliet

The children will learn about Shakespeare's most well-known story and explore the themes of love, rivalry and tragedy through a combination of writing and drama.



COMPUTING

We are Advertisers

In this unit, pupils review existing adverts, create a storyboard, shoot original footage, and edit a final version.

We are AI Developers

We will use a variety of websites to learn about different aspects of artificial intelligence.



MUSIC

Year 6 Performance

As the end of Year 6 approaches, the children will learn songs for their Year 6 Leavers Performance. They will have the opportunity to audition for a part, help with costume design, set production and prop creation.



PE/GAMES

Athletics, Rounders, Tri Golf and Cricket

The children will be taught a wide range of track and field techniques in athletics. They will learn how to apply the rules of tri golf, cricket and rounders and will begin to explore the sport-specific skills required to play these team sports successfully. Children will have the opportunity to evaluate their own and others performances.

RE

What impact do religious believers have on their community both locally and globally?

The children will be researching the different religions and the impacts they have within their local community; using this research to then analyse global impact.



ART *Banksy*

The children will explore Graffiti and street art focussing on the work of Banksy. They will work with different materials to create their own street art creations.



DT *Gonks*

The children will practice a variety of sewing stitches including running, back and cross stitch. They will then design, make and evaluate a gonk.

PSHE

Health and Wellbeing

The children will gain an understanding of what affects mental health and ways to take care of it; managing change, loss and bereavement as well as managing time online. They will also explore human reproduction and birth. They will be taught -how to keep personal information safe as well as looking at regulations and choices in their lives.
